I am looking forward to the start of this New Year. 2003 is going to be great. I am very excited about the artists that I will be featuring / interviewing this month. On January 5, I will be featuring and interviewing the Songwriter Finalists for the South Florida Folk Festival that will take place on January 18 and 19. Dave Cambest from the Folk festival will be with me on the show helping with the interviews. Also on January 5, I am will feature Ms. Perry Smilw. Perry is from Brooklyn and she is a very famous Jewish folk singer. Perry is the originator of the "Freedom Music Project" which features a chorus of Jewish and Black singers who sing among other things about bridging the gap between the Jewish and black community in New York City.

January 13, I will feature Jerry Gray. Jerry Gray is a famous banjo player in Canada. He is currently in Florida teaching a course on Folk Music and Protest at Florida Atlantic University. Jerry founded a Canadian group in the early 50s called the Travelers. The Travelers played music that was banned in this country. The Travelers started as a protest band; they played the music of the Weavers also. On January 19, I will be playing the pre-recorded National Blue Grass Awards that took place in November. This awards show will be a two-hour show.

I recently received a really nice CD from Enoch Kent: *I* am a Working Chap. Enoch is a Scottish acapella singer with a thick brogue, his songs are poignant and just incredible.
