THE PREZ SEZ... 2003 in ReviewBy **Barry J. White**

It's that time of year when we look back and ask, "What have we been up to?" Quite a lot, actually. Our mission, according to our by-laws, is to promote the performance, awareness, and appreciation of traditional and contemporary folk music, the development of local folk talent, and to



showcase local and national folk performers." That's exactly what we've been doing; let's look at some numbers. We produced 27 shows with a total audience of over 2500 guests. We booked 86 acts and distributed almost \$17,000 in contributions and fees. We had twelve Song Swaps and produced a dozen Folk Notes, thanks to the unflagging and superb work of John and Maria Barker. While the statistics ain't at "national tour" levels, it ain't chopped liver either. We've seen fine national and local performers and made a lot of new friends in folk. Our membership is now at its highest levels.

Our venues for the year were The Acoustic Underground Series at Luna Star Café, Folk Friday In North Miami, Folk Music In The Gardens at Pinecrest Gardens, The Amelia Earhart Farm Village Folk Music & Crafts Festival, plus the Song swaps on the second Sunday of each month. Let's look at some numbers.

This year saw the demise of Folk Friday due to budgetary concerns. We are grateful to the people and to the government of North Miami, Florida for sponsoring almost three years of shows. Now we can say it, we were never rained out for that event; even on the night we cancelled the show on their stage due threat of rain and moved the performers to the Luna Star Café, it never actually rained. It was indeed a blessed event which introduced many adults and kids to our music. Thanks to all.

The year also welcomed two new venues. Thanks to the efforts of Jim Fishman, The Village Of Pinecrest agreed to sponsor Folk Music In The Gardens at Pinecrest Gardens for one year beginning July, 2003. And what a gem it has turned out to be! You could call it "Folk Music in the Garden Of Eden"; it doesn't get more sublime. Lovely folks and fine to work with. We are so grateful.

The second new venue, Amelia Earhart Park, is our first effort with the Miami-Dade County Department Of Parks And Recreation. It was the vision of Jack Kardys, Director Of Operations, to bring our music to this lovely and unique setting. Building on that successful event, we are looking forward to repeating it next fall plus possibly adding shows at other park venues throughout the county. This will truly bring folk music to the people. Thanks to Jack and to all the dedicated people in the Department.

Let's not forget the consistent and quality work of George Blackwell who looks after our website even though he and Lori have relocated to a halcyon retreat in northern Florida. He updated the site this year and streamlined our web address: www.souflafolk.com. George and Lori, we look forward to your visits and to your performing for us.

So, there's an update. We thank you for your support. Thanks to the Folk Club members and volunteers who made it all happen. There is always work for anyone who has the time and inclination to get involved with the activities of the Folk Club; just let us know you are interested. All the best for the New Year to all of you; you're some of the finest folks around.

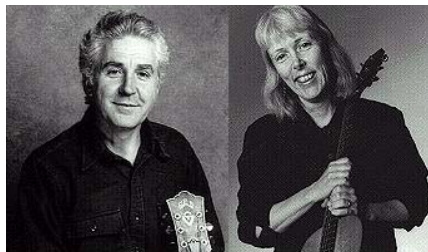

Cyd Ward & Dave Potts

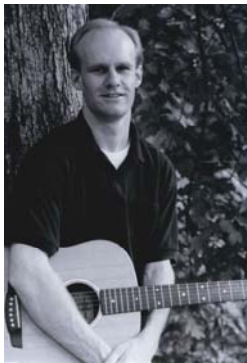

Cyd Ward has enchanted listeners for many years past with her unique style of songwriting and performing. Walking somewhat in the footsteps of her idol Gillian Welch, Cyd crafts songs with an old time traditional story telling style. Originally from Seattle, Cyd's formative

years included music of all styles, many of which subtly found their way into her songs. Playing everything from the recorder to the saxophone and the piano most of her life, she recently became enamored of the acoustical stringed instruments. A poet since her early years, her songwriting was instigated by the gift of a guitar a few years ago. Cyd has been a past finalist in SFFF Singer/Songwriter Competition as well as other national songwriting contests such as the Kerrville New Folk, , and Unisong International song contests, and winner in the Suwannee Springfest, Great American Song Contest, and Songwriters Showcase of America competitions.

Dave Potts left his home in Denver, CO in 1998, and hasn't looked back since. From the time he first stepped foot in the picturesque town of Auburn, Alabama, he knew he had found his place. His years of traveling throughout the country brought him a loyal following, a catalog of over 400 original songs, and a sense of what he wanted out of his life. The slow-pace of life and the smalltown landscape of Alabama fit not only Dave's life, but his music. Though his songwriting style has taken on a regional feel, it has brought his music national attention. In 2003, Dave was a finalist at the prestigious Kerrville Folk Festival New Folk Contest, as well as the Telluride Troubador contest in Colorado.

Happy New Year. I am not good at making New Year resolutions: on second thoughts, I do very well at making them, keeping them is where I fail. So, I don't make them anymore. I will continue, though, on the path I have sought to promote quality folk music on the radio. This is what in store for this month.

January 11 - Freebo. He was Bonnie Raitt's original bassist, has played bass with a list of greats too many to name here, is willing to jam and share his knowledge with all who ask, and as of late, has called himself a folk musician because of the acceptance he has found among our friendly family. And, South Florida musician and author Rob Koppelman. Rob has just published a new biography of Lee Hayes, one of the most colorful and under appreciated members of the original Weavers. The Weavers were the first American folk group with best selling records in the 1940s. Rob and I will talk about the music and politics at the start of the commercialization of American folk music.

January 18 - If you are not at the south Florida folk Festival and happen to be listening to the radio, today I will feature the Fourteenth Annual International Bluegrass Awards Show (recorded live late last year). I first thought this was a goof many years ago, but there is some great music here and, dare I say, bluegrass now is marketed better and enjoys a bigger following than folk music. And, If all goes as planned, I will have a recorded telephone interview with Tom Rush.

January 25 - Mad Agnes will be in the studio. The more I listen to this trio, I imagine a group that has the potential to break the traditional folk mold and appeal to all audiences of how good this genre can be.

Have a great year and I look forward to the surprises that this New Year will bring.
