Upon the time-consecrated dais of the Hatch Shell, by the bonny, bonny banks of the River Chuck, in the venerable City of Boston, there appeared this day a gathering of esteemed personages, by now known to all, but not so then...

For upon the stage that day were the Royale Madrigals, in all their splendor and consummate glory. Also in attendance that sunny August day were a curious duo of guitar and bodhran (and two youthful voices), new to the realm and mostly unknown, who called themselves Brigid's Brood after their Matron Deity, Brigid - the Irish Goddess of Fire and Poetry.

During the course of the Faire season, the tenor for the Royale Madrigals (a fine guitarist in his own right: the inimitable Grant Foster) broke bread with the guitarist for Brigid's Brood (who is of course none other than our own Gregor Harvey)...

They quickly put together a small body of Irish, Scottish, and English songs, and when the weather cleared up and the sun came out, these intrepid minstrels went to the Shire of Harvard (square, that is), to try their luck in the fast-paced glamorous world of street performance. 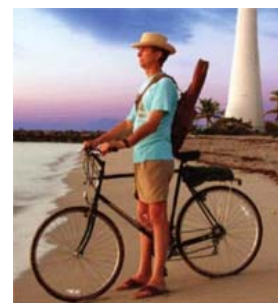
Hope to see you on February 8. Don't go through life without touching the walls; start, or continue, with ours.

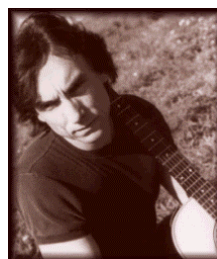
Amy Steinberg

Here is what I have planned so far for my radio show this month.

On Feb 8, one of the greats, Carla Ulbrich. Carla has a quick wit and brilliant mind for fun folk music. She has won the South Florida Folk Festival's Songwriting Contest and gets regular air on Dr Demento radio for her off-color songs. She recently had a severe illness, and has recovered and wrote a bunch of new songs about it.

On Feb 15, I will have a phone interview with Roy Bookbinder. Roy is a direct connection to an older generation of blues artists that has since died. He is a favorite to guitar pickers and blues fans alike plus he tells great stories.

On Feb 22 - Rod MacDonald will make an appearance on the show to share his insight to our political state. He has a knack of writing what everyone is thinking. I can't wait to ask him about his new humorous song about the governor of California, and the serious song about terror.

On Feb 29 - Theresa Lingstrom, an artist who comes highly recommended with a strong following in south Florida, but not necessarily in folk music circles.

A lot of surprises in store throughout the month, mainly because there is a lot of great talent coming south to play at area clubs, including Muriel Andersen, Si Kahn, Amy Fradon, D.L. Lалуer, and others. Take Care
