## Remembering Rachel Bissex

I first met Rachel in 1998 when I accompanied Brian Wolfsohn to Power Studios in Miami for an in-the-round with Marie Nofsinger, Big Blue Sky and Ms. Bissex -Brian is a long-time friend of Rachel's and introduced me to her before the show. I went to my first Folk Alliance in Albuquerque February 1999 and Rachel hosted the wonderful Emerging Artists showcase rather than solo artists taking turns, the room was composed of a core group of performers, backing each other up on harmonies and instrumentation as individual songs were spotlighted. The phrase that most comes up when talking about Rachel is "generosity of spirit" and this format was so typical of her - she always stressed collaboration and cooperation.

Rachel Bissex was one of those people - when she wrote Just Like That (about Vic and Reba Heyman, among others), she could just as well have been singing about herself. Dancing with My Mother speaks of the "joy and the desperation in music" - Rachel reflected the dichotomy.

Rachel took the Folk Train from Montreal to the Vancouver Folk Alliance in February 2001 - there's a great recounting in story and photos: http://www.gotfolk.com/artists/victorheyman/folktrain2001.htm

Rachel's song *In the Middle* was included on Volume II of the compilation *Before Their Time*, "a musical resource to promote healing, and it contains far more than entertainment. Dedicated to the memory of people who died young it is intended to help survivors recover from the emotional trauma and extended grief." http://www.beforetheirtime.org/contents.html. Many are aware of the lovely video of Rachel's song Here Now, made and performed at NERFA (Northeast Regional Folk Alliance) by a large group of friends - you can see the video at www.ericschwartz.com/herenow.html and go to www.rachelbissex.com for more info on Rachel's recordings and life history.

Rachel was a headliner at our South Florida Folk Festival in 1996 and again in January 2004 - she was diagnosed with breast cancer in March 2003, battled tirelessly and seemingly conquered... until this recent reoccurrence. Her latest CD, In White Light, chronicles much of this journey - to quote Rachel: "even though [the songs] were written before all my troubles, they deal mostly with the themes of hope, strength, kindness, and living in the moment. Appropriate".

Rachel Bissex had a huge impact, both personally and professionally, on our South Florida, as well as the

national, folk community - my tale of blessings is but one of countless others.

"there's a moral to this story, it's obvious it seems you can be a queen, you can outlive all your dreams but don't forget to leave a little something behind you when you go especially if you plan to walk off naked in the snow do not be afraid, do not be afraid..."

## Notes from the Road

As I've pointed out before, the road is an analogy, a stage to set the actions of an inner tour, and I will occasionally share some stops of that tour here.



That this inner visit comes at a time when the car is stationary and the gig list short is pure coincidence.

My guitar playing and clothing improved, the guitar through practice, the clothes an assembled costume from thrift store cast-offs. While I note these changes, I am aware that neither facet required a whole lot of effort to qualify as "improvement". It's not unlike the little plastic cup given for "Most Improved" bowler in that you can't start off as a mediocre bowler and hope to win that trophy. "Most Improved" is an honor you can only achieve by beginning at "terrible".

I think Dan Marino holds the record for most fourth quarter come from behind victories, a similar honor, as it leaves unstressed the record number of times he need to play poorly enough to be losing after three quarters.

As I hold proudly my little plastic cup, I thank two fellow performers, one of them Sam Pacetti, whose words two years ago finally made sense. "Just think it," he said, "and let your fingers go." The other came from Chris Chandler, the simple comment "You don't respect the stage," regarding my dress, a nugget panned from the sloshings of a 12 pack of Bud Light on my DC back porch.

That all three of us came to performing after experiencing one Gamble Rogers, that a simple storyteller/songwriter could be weaving threads and twining strands still, puts a perspective to this craft and art that makes me want to respect it more than I have.
