He performs over two hundred times a year for tens of thousands of people all across the nation and abroad. He has been part of The Morgans folk band since 1973 and hit the road full time in 1977 after five years of junior high school teaching.

His credits include: ABC's Good Morning America"; PBS' "Shining Time Station" starring Ringo Starr; CNN's "Earth Matters"; and NPR. Excerpts from two original songs "Glasnost To Go" and "They're Not Evil Anymore" were included in Connecticut Public Televisions' Emmy Award winning documentary: "A Connecticut Yankee In Red Square". Gary Doles played "The Flick" and "The Lion's Share" before moving to Gainesville and St. Augustine for about 15 years. 



US-17 peels off 95 South to Savannah, a two-lane rural road winding through fallow farmland, old oaks in full leaf, faded billboards offering



God's salvation at five different churches along the twelve mile stretch. In Mississippi the casinos use

them to call their flock to another kind of church, a different type of salvation, probably to deeper prayer.

I am hours early to a gig that came unsolicited through the ether, someone who bought my CD off the website and asked if I would come down to play for her youth ministry. I am still at the point where I accept any gig, anywhere, anytime, and figure out whether it's a good idea after I do it. I've dusted off some old Christian songs from when Jesus and I were better friends, and I wander the cobbled streets of Savannah, gawking at the trees like the tourist I am. The gig goes fine, I guess, it's hard to tell, the audience is attentive enough but I think it is out of politeness rather than interest.

Earlier this month we went to an open mic at Jammin' Java in VA and saw Chris Chandler go on two spots before us. He lives six blocks from me, in Takoma Park, as he lived six blocks from me in Hollywood, FL. We have kicked some tunes about, and I am mining my old cynicism. The next weekend took me to The Minstrel Coffeehouse in NJ, opening for Small Potatoes. Sitting outside talking with Jacquie and Rich before my set and I have that delicious terror, waiting for the moment to play, to bomb or to fly. I'm booked back as a feature June 30, so it must have gone well. Slept on Mike Agranoff's sofa after swapping songs with him 'till 2AM.

Plowshares Song Contest is the next day, and I meander the back roads, taking six hours to make the two hour trip, a thermos of Starbucks, through the villages and shires of northern Pennsylvania. Erik Balkey is there when I arrive, cold drinks and warm pizza in a 200 year old Quaker meeting house. Ten songwriters play unamplified, with Buddy Mondlock closing the show. It was a weekend of singularly amazing experiences, any one of which would have been worth the trip, all strung together, making me want to wax Engelslike. Antje Duvekot's landlady song, Elliot Bronson's "Narcoleptic Nymphomaniac", Small Potatoes with "1000 Candles, 1000 Cranes", and Mike Agranoff with a six minute version of Hamlet. Kate McDonnel wins the contest, rightly so, Antie Duvekot runner-up, rightly so.

So far the road has been a kind teacher to a slow student. New songs crowd each other out, more gigs coming up than ever before, not all plums but all interesting. Recognizing that the only way to practice playing a lot is to just play a lot. Back to Texas for a round at Uncle Calvin's in May, as with the Minstrel, getting booked to play again is the best response I can hope for. At times, in certain moments, I do think I'm getting better.
