# FOLK MUSIC IN THE SCHOOLS:

Have Project, Need Grant or Sugar Daddy By Barry J. White

The Folk Club Of South Florida and Miami-Dade Public Schools have agreed to a program which will eventually provide curriculum, teaching aids (CD's and sheet music) and performers for folk music in all of Miami-Dade Counties public schools. Ms. Lilla Garcia, Administrative Director, Division of Life Skills and Special Projects and Mr. James A. Smith, District Supervisor for Music Education have worked with The Folk Club in designing the program. The elements are agreed to; now we need a little bread. All we need is a grant writer, corporate sponsor or philanthropist to provide about \$5,000 to make it all work.

In 1996 the Music Editors National Conference compiled a list of 42 songs they felt all Americans should know. Starting with that list a committee of Folk Club members focused on grades three to five and made a list of twenty songs appropriate for that level. The plan is to start there, then do K-2, 6-8, and



9-12. Members of the Folk Club will write a curriculum including sheet music and the history of each song explaining any obscure words or references. The Folk Club will produce a CD for each grade grouping. All of this material will be provided to every music teacher with a song book for every child. The CD's will be available for sale to the children and to the public. Performers will meet with small groups of about fifty children to perform and discuss the songs the children have learned.

# MICHAEL STOCK on Folk and Acoustic Music

WLRN radio presenter, Michael Stock, begins a monthly column about South Florida's folk and acoustic music scene. Listen to Michael's show every Sunday from 1:00 to 4:00 PM on WLRN, 91.3 MHz. Contact Michael at: 305-995-1717, or email: mstock@wlrn.org



New people appear constantly on the folk scene. I get about an average of 15 new CD's a week: some are from prominent artists that we are familiar with, others are from people that are unknown. When I put my show together I try to promote and play music that listeners would not hear anywhere else and I mix them with other better known people. I try to legitimize the performers we are not familiar with.

When I listen to a CD for the first time I look for a folk quality. If it sounds like it is for the pop market or it is a highly produced CD that will to be sent to all the radio stations, I get turned off by that: those artists do not need a public radio station to promote them. I tend to try to promote the little guy: people who believe music is first and the commercial aspect of it, the promotion is second. I have no problem in finding material like that. There are so many new artists that I try to include in my program, however if I get no response from the listeners the CD gets put in a file.

Theoretically, folk music does not belong on the radio, it belongs in the home, in the living room, and around camp fires, I try to make folk music popular through my program.

The quality of local folk and acoustic musicians can be seen at places like the Broward Folk Club Festival. Local artists get a chance to see standards to strive for. There are many talented local names. Amy Carol Webb is really outstanding, Grant Livingston is excellent too. Charissa Johnson is a newcomer to the folk circuit: she is young and has a chance to develop a wide audience.

I like to include World Music, English folk music and American traditional music as a big part of what I do in my program. The mix is very big, because being the only folk music radio show, I feel like I have to represent it all. I just got a new CD from John McCutcheon, he is one of the exceptional talents we have today. His writing is very true to himself: for example he has a peace song that I like, I admire an artist who is willing to take a stance.

Following in the mould of English folk traditionalist's, Kate Rusby is new on the scene, she is incredible: really great. I do not claim to know so much about English folk music, fortunately the independent labels send me CD's that are launched in the UK. Excellent groups such as Fairport Convention do not get played on our radio stations.

I am very comfortable that I have been able to play the music that I really like, and I have done this long enough to realize that I know what I like and what I do not like. However, I think I still have about 600 CD's I have not listened to. It is frustrating for me that I am not able to keep up with the volume of CD's I receive.

I have a proposal: I would like ask readers to help me review my backlog of CD's, and to publish four reviews each month as part of my column. I also propose giving a CD to the best review published each month. Based on the feedback from reviews I will include selected music in my program. That's all for now, more Folk and Acoustic Music next month.

A Billy Jonas performance is an explosion of energy. In sing a-longs, bang alongs, whisper a-longs, as well as improvised songs, his primary instrument is the audience. Everyone becomes part of a performance that reaches out and "... touches even the most hardened



of hearts." (Fayetteville Morning News). His concerts begin with a simple "tuning" of the audience; from there a whimsical trajectory carries listeners through stories of life, love, and triumph over 'Murphy's Law. Billy Jonas's original pieces are played on fanciful "industrial re-percussion" instruments made from found objects. He sings in a clear tenor voice; his guitar work is adventurous, alternately percussive and lyrical.

Billy Jonas' heartwarming work has been enjoyed across North America since 1987. Previously a member of the highly acclaimed duo, "The Billys," he has been featured at prestigious festivals and venues nationwide and he has shared stages with some of the world's favorite acoustic artists, including Patti Larkin, Ani DiFranco, David Wilcox, Richard Thompson, and Pete Seeger.

Billy believe it or not has a degree in Anthropology. He has stated that both anthropology and songwriting have something in common: one is required to step back and look at what is going on in a culture and/or climb into a deep side of a personal experience and communicate this to others. Billy says that he has always been inspired by the music of "tribal" cultures, where everyone is invited to participate and the distinction between the audience and the performer is blur.

After College when Billy Jonas began writing songs more seriously he would often attend open stages to try out his new songs. Billy states that if the songs were not finished musically, but the words seemed done he would just take a water bottle drum to keep the rhythm while he sang. People loved these songs so what Billy did was to have a lot of songs and to just keep developing more instruments to create more variations in the accompaniment. Billy states that he

thinks a good approach to understanding what he does is to point out that besides his focus on the writing aspect of being a singer/songwriter, the primary instrument he plays is the audience.
