The Essence Of Festivals

Never been to a folk festival? Let me tell vou about our visit to the Florida Folk Festival at White Springs, Florida, Memorial Day Weekend 2002. It is held at the Stephen Foster Folk Culture Center State Park. This was the 50th Annual Festival and spirits were exceptionally high since there were moments in the



year before when some doubted that it would happen. The state pulled the funding but money was found including a substantial contribution by George Steinbrenner, Bless him. But, that's not our story. Ronnie, my better half, and I had been to White Springs before: we wanted to be part of that special festival. Imagine 150 acts per day from 10:00 A.M to 10:00 P.M. during three days. We were there each day for the first shows and stayed well into the evening. A fine array of talent and genres including folk music from Florida and many ethnicities throughout the world. The park is huge so there is plenty of walking to catch the acts or workshops you want to see.

In addition to all of this, the evenings are filled with energy and warmth inspired by dance and song circles. For us, the contra dancing late in the evening accompanied by some of the best musicians and callers around is almost worth the whole trip. We think it's the most fun you can have with your clothes on. Contra dancing is actually old English dancing; it's mentioned in The Scarlet Pimpernel placed in 18th century England.

After this, we headed for the musicians' campgrounds where the RV's and tents are set up. Besides being able to visit with the performers, you have the chance to hear them informally around campfires or lanterns or candles as they take their turns around the circle, and if you like, to contribute a song of your own and to sing along with whole group. And, since there are many such gatherings in the camp, each one has it's own personality and you can migrate between them.

We left the song circles at 2:00 A.M. on Sunday morning. Full moon, clear sky, sixty eight dry degrees. We walked alone through the oak and pine forest to our car enjoying the quiet, the solitude, the company.

There are some rare moments on this earth that stay with you forever, and this is one of them. With the warmth of the music and interactions still vibrating in us, the setting was even more magical. I wrote this shortly thereafter:

Filling In The Spaces

"It was nice singing harmony with you", she, a stranger, said as I left the campfire song circle.

"Just filling in the spaces", thought I Sometimes we lead, sometimes we follow;

Depends on where we see the need to fill in the spaces

New town, new causes. Put in some time, show your mettle. Pitch in, sweat a little, see what has to be done to fill in the spaces

"Got a son, getting a masters, building a new life" she told me. A lovely, solid lady; I made her my wife so we can fill in the spaces

Tell us your thoughts, tell us your dreams.
Then tell us what you did
to fill in the spaces

"I give you dominion. Take care of the Earth, So it will take care of you. Just fill in the spaces"

Happy New Year to our Jewish friends, L'Shana Tova TikoTavu V'tihatamu. May you be inscribed and sealed for a good year.

Rod MacDonald - If Rod MacDonald did not exist as a contemporary folk singer here in South Florida, we would have to invent him.. He is our link to the sixties coffee houses of Greenwich Village, Celtic word craft and protest writing. His unused law degree is a tip-off to the honed and insightful mind



with which he observes and comments on our lives. Social and political writing and love songs flow naturally and subtly from his pen as he delivers them with understated energy out of a craggy face while clothed as a veteran beachcomber. *Rod* probably performs more hours each year than any other folk musician in the area. 

clawhammer," and a master of fingerstyle guitar. Not only is he a superb instrumentalist, he is an acclaimed teacher of instrumental skills, a gifted performer, and an award-winning Folklorist. He is considered one of the top clawhammer



players in the world, known in particular for his skillful adaptations of Celtic tunes to the style. On guitar, Ken's sparkling finger-picked renditions of traditional Celtic and Southern fiddle tunes are simply not to be missed.

Ken is an acclaimed teacher of folk-music instrumental skills. He has written some of the most widely respected banjo and guitar instruction books of modern times, and he has been on staff at prestigious teaching festivals around the world. He has also served as director, and co-director for several instructional banjo camps. Also an active folklorist, Ken has spent over a decade collecting tunes and oral histories from traditional fiddle players on Prince Edward Island in eastern Canada.

Although Ken's focus is on instrumentals, he does not ignore the vocal element. In a typical show, he sings a variety of numbers drawn from such traditions as acoustic blues, ragtime, ballads, minstrel show music, and Southern string band music. He also tells stories, offers accounts of his music-collecting experiences, and makes wry comments on our lives and times. First, I want to thank all of you who supported folk music on the radio with your pledges of support during our semi-annual on-air fundraiser. Public radio WLRN does not sell air-time, and most of the underwriting focuses primarily on shows with greater numbers of listeners and network programs, such as Morning Edition, All Things Considered, Car Talk and Prairie Home Companion.

Shows produced locally, like "Folk & Acoustic Music" are constantly under a lot more pressure to raise money to justify it's existence, and the station manager has specifically told me he would rather have a talk show in its place and does not consider you one of WLRN's "core" listeners. Providing a service or filling a niche does not guarantee staying on the air on public radio anymore. With the help of Sarah Walker, "Folk and Acoustic Music" raised a record \$14,000 in 3 hours on air.

I also want to remember Paul Joseph, a law professor from Nova SE University who was a big fan of the show and passed away way just a few weeks ago. His widow and friends got together and paid tribute to Paul with pledges during the fundraiser and a special set of music was dedicated to his memory. Thank you all again who listened and pledged, I am truly fortunate that I have the opportunity to share the music I love on the radio and that you enjoy and support it as well.

I will mention in passing that I feel very frustrated that folk music is not more popular. It deserves more exposure in the local newspapers and weekly papers. One of the problems is that folk music is so hard to define, and consequently hard to sell. Folk music includes other (if not all) genres (acoustic, bluegrass, blues, old time, singer/songwriter, topical, gospel, ballads), but it is so much more. On my radio show, I try to play music that you do not hear anywhere else

and support the musicians who have dedicated their lives to this art.

This month on the radio, aside from many new releases, there will be numerous interviews of artists looking for live audiences for their shows here in south Florida. Oct 5, Cliff Eberhardt and Dave Feder, October 12, Andrew Calhoun and Klezmer music (a preview of KlezFest Miami) and banjo devotee Ken Perlman. October 19, Sarah Walker and Vince Martin. Stay tuned, I am sure there will a few other surprises.

Finally, I would like to thank Dan Lima and all the nice folks at The City of North Miami for their support of Folk Friday over the past years. Although funding for "Folk Friday" has dried up due to the current economic situation, we had a great run presenting free folk music every month for the community.
