Very few folk singers, and even less, those in South Florida, take the plunge and give over their lives and their livelihoods to creating and performing folk music. It's a tremendous leap of faith and self confidence and, some would say, foolhardiness. Never-the-



less, it's the only way to truly give one's talent and skill to develop their full potential. *Grant Livingston* is one such artist and we are the beneficiaries of his commitment. His insight, wit, playfulness and skill have only grown as he continues to look at what we see everyday and to see it in a slightly different and funnier way. *Grant* has been a favorite at folk venues since the mid-eighties. His offbeat humor comes through whether he's giving a philosophy of life lesson, *Pointy Side Up*, or planning his own funeral, *A Little Invitation*. 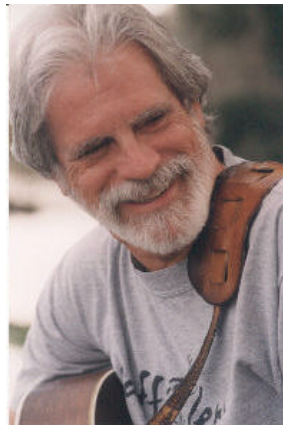

Jack Williams is an international - class guitarist / singer / songwriter based in Columbia, SC. He is outstanding among the handful of artists who, in skill, depth and integrity, are simply beyond the pale of most performers on the circuit. Among acoustic guitarists, he is near-legendary. Having avoided the compromises

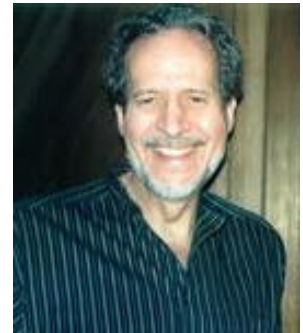


of the commercial music industry during his 41-year professional career, he has preferred working the road, playing coffeehouses, concerts and festivals week in, week out, from the sheer love and respect of music. Jack has had acclaimed appearances at Kerrville, Philadelphia and other music festivals and venues, and at many Folk Alliance Conferences, where his guitar-playing, songs, and commanding personal presence always cause a considerable buzz. He was invited in 2000 to participate in the World Folk Music Association Concert, along with Odetta, Oscar Brand, Tom Paxton, the Limelighters, and others. He has accompanied Tom Paxton, Peter Yarrow, Lucy Kaplansky, Ellis Paul, Mickey Newbury and many others.

Skeedlepop and Deny Rowand

Two of South Florida's most-loved musicians return to The Main Street Café in a special double-bill. Skeedlepop is a veteran of the folk scene, having played all over the U.S. for the past 30 years. He has received critical acclaim with his latest CD, 'Don't Get Your



Hopes Up', a collection of original songs beautifully written and arranged. Deny Rowand, who heads up the blues band 'Outta d' Blues', is a masterful acoustic blues guitarist as well as a terrific singer. The combination of these two performers is something you won't want to miss.

Jean Bratman and Dan Pelletier

Another terrific double-bill! Jean Bratman is steadily earning recognition as a performing songwriter whose



work is literate, playful, and musical. Her self-produced debut CD, 'Imperfect World', features 11 originals that meld folk, blues, pop and rock with Jean on acoustic guitar, piano and vocals. Desire and connection are celebrated, as the songwriter looks with humor at some of the tradeoffs required of being an adult. Jean was a songwriting finalist at last year's South Florida Folk Festival as well as the



1998 Telluride Troubadour Contest. Dan Pelletier, also a finalist at last year's South Florida Folk Festival, is known for his soulful voice and powerful piano playing.



He never fails to delight audiences with his wit and tenderness and his shows feature just the right touch of sarcasm tempered by warmth, realistic idealism and a passion for life, love and pursuit of happiness. These two performers have been traveling around the country together joining their musical forces for what promises to be a great concert.

Tom Prasada-Rao

CD REVIEW'S**MICHAEL COONEY: Together Again**

COVE HAVEN RECORDS, CHRCD001 / 17 TRACKS, 53:49

Michael Stock of WLRN-FM'S "Folk and Acoustic Music" recently asked for volunteers to help sort his many weekly CD arrivals and to write a few reviews for the Folk Notes. I'm grateful that I responded to his request. This was one of the first CD's Michael Stock handed me. What a splendid find !

Michael Cooney's new recording "Together Again" is an absolute delight - a treasure of love, the love of bright minds, and the proverbial "sparkle of shining marble." Every track is wonderful, and the 53-minute jewel flows like a happy river. He sings with a distinctive voice, a bit craggy at times, but beautiful in its individuality. He is a masterful musician. To me, he sounds like he was inspired in his formative past partly by Pete Seeger for the lone quality of the spirit he evokes and communicates. I saw Michael Cooney live in concert only once, at the Florida Folk Festival in 1972 (apparently the only time he has ever played in Florida). He doesn't write his own material, but he chooses it very wisely and well. He sometimes haunts the Library of Congress in research, and he always comes up with rare gems to augment his creative endeavors, album and concert alike. He is well-known in the Northeast, and he lives in Maine.

Nick is a very rare but extraordinary talent who has kept his wonderful songwriting skills hidden until recently. Nick has played many open mike's and is a regular at the Main Street Café. He has however recently begun performing at gigs with his new partner, Elizabeth Crisfield. Elizabeth adds depth and harmonies to Nick's songs with her excellent fiddle playing and vocals.



The Road That You Planned has been on my CD player for the past two weeks, I never tire of listening to compositions such as 'Background Scenery' (track 1) and 'Time to go' (track 2). 'Time to go' is on my list for the best song of 2002 by the way. Listen to 'June 1989' for a poignant commentary on the Tiananmen Square uprising. So very good!. Track 6, 'God is Good' is an inspiration for our lives. Elizabeth plays fiddle on one track. Laurie Oudin adds vocal harmonies and LeSa plays mandolin and mandola on the recording.

SPOTLIGHT ON THE ARTIST OF THE MONTH

Christine Lavin

In 1984, Christine quit her day job at Bellvue Hospital to pursue a career in music full-time. Since then she has recorded nine solo original albums, produced six compilations showcasing songs by dozens of her favorite singer/songwriters, and is part of three *Four Bitchin' Babes* albums. She has published one solo songbook, two group compilations, has won two New York Music Awards, three ASCAP composer awards, a NAIRD Award for Folk Album of the Year and the Kate Wolf Memorial Award, given yearly by the World Folk Music Association.



Some of Christine's songs have been recorded by artists as diverse as Andrea Marcovici, Dave Van Ronk, and the Dartmouth Decibelles. In October of 1996 her latest group compilation, the two disc, all-humorous 21 artist Laugh Tracks was released by Shanachie Entertainment, and *Shining My Flashlight on the Moon* was released in March of 1997. In September of 1998, *One Wild Night in Concert*, a live recording of a concert in Bloomington, Illinois, was released on Christine's new christinelavin.com records - and is available through Prime CD. Her song "Sensitive New Age Guys" is in the long-running Off-Broadway production of "A. . . My Name Will Always Be Alice,"

and her science-based song "If We Had No Moon" will be included in an album of all space-related music to be released by the National Space Society later in 2001. Christine performs 120 concerts per year, a career that continues to take her all over the US, Canada and Australia. In her free time Christine writes essays and articles (The Washington Post, The St. Petersburg Times, Delta "Sky" Magazine, The Performing Songwriter Magazine) and was the host and now guest host for the popular "Sunday Breakfast" radio program on WFUV 90.7 FM, public radio, from Fordham University in New York City.
